Once you have selected a merit badge program, be sure to choose "select another date" to view all dates that merit badge program is offered. Scouts should come to the program prepared. This means they should review the merit badge overview found on the JMDC website under the Downloads tab. Scouts should be prepared to discuss, explain and engage in program topic discussions to meet Scouting requirements. If something is required to be written, it should be done prior to the program so it can be evaluated and discussed with the merit badge counselor. Scouts should bring something to drink, a snack, and be ready to go outside if the Counselor chooses to do so. Uniform dress code is determined by the Scout's Unit. Regardless of Unit policy, JMDC is a family friendly facility and we ask that clothing be family firendly. Closed toed footwear is required.

JMDC MERIT BADGE PROGRAM

Scouts interested in earning a BSA Merit Badge need to <u>be prepared</u>. This means they should review the two BSA National links above to be completely familiar with the BSA Merit Badge Program and the BSA Merit Badge requirements for their selected merit badge.

On the day of the merit badge program each Scout should have a copy of the merit badge book with them. They should be prepared to discuss, explain and engage in program topic discussions to meet the BSA National requirements. If something is required to be written, it should be done prior to the program so it can be evaluated and discussed with the Merit Badge Counselor. Additionally, Scouts should have several of the BSA 10 essentials with them; something to drink (water), trail food (snacks), and be ready to go outside if the Counselor decides to.

The uniform to wear is up to the Scout's Unit. Regardless of Unit policy JMDC is a family facility and we ask that clothing be family friendly. Closed toe footwear is required and rugged closed toe footwear is strongly recommended and in some cases may be required for outdoor hiking.

NAME MERIT BADGE

REQUIREMENTS

On the day of the program, the Scout must be prepared to discuss the requirements from the merit badge booklet. To assist the Scout helpful discussion notes should be made and pages can be bookmarked in the merit badge booklet. All Scouts must engage in the program discussions to complete the merit badge.

Requirements are listed in the front of the merit badge booklet or open the link above under **BSA Merit Badges**, scroll down and choose your merit badge. Bring a copy of the merit badge booklet to the program along with a pen or pencil, discussion notes, blank paper for taking additional notes, and additional program requirements.

Before coming to the program, choose three groups that have different racial, cultural, national or ethnic backgrounds, one of which comes from your own background. Use these groups to meet requirements 1, 2 and 3. Complete the requirements:

- Requirement #1 Complete two of the listed activities. Be prepared to give a presentation in program.
- Requirement #2 Discussion during program.
- Requirement #3 Discussion during program.
- Requirement #4 Discussion during program.
- Requirement #5 Bring proof of completion to program.

To get the most out of the merit badge program you need to **be prepared**. You and the others in the program will get the most benefit if you are all prepared!
